FISH POND CONTRACT SIGNED

After more than a year of patience, the moment was finally there last month: the fish pond contract between the Colombian Institute for Agricultural Development (INCODER) and San Martin de Amacayacu has been signed! Unfortunately, the community still does not know when the budget will be there, but the fact that it will arrive at some point is at least more confirmed. Lucky enough, there is the BN/DeStem Development Prize of 2009, with which the costs for necessary documents, administration and a security policy are being paid (around 300 euro so far, and this amount once again in the coming weeks). These costs would otherwise have been an important hurdle for the community to complete procedures. The digging activities, so enthusiastically started a year ago and then abandoned in doubt, can now be continued with the same energy!



GOT IT DONE!

Lucky enough, many people "gave a shit" during theater festival De Parade in the Netherlands this summer: San Martin's proposal to GET WATER&TRANSPORT DONE easily obtained the complete budget of 7575 euro for about 30 water tanks, a new aluminum boat and a small outboard motor (all depending on the exchange rate).


The project is to be developed in the coming six months. An impression of the very creative action of the Get It Done crew:
